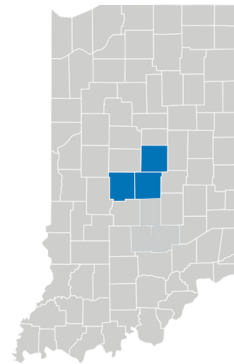

Cost Savings

Each year, businesses lose **\$1,640 per working parent** due to child care-related absences, and Indiana economy loses **\$2.2 billion** due to child care issues.²



Improved Recruitment, Morale, & Retention

88% of working mothers say flexibility, predictable hours, or child care support make them more likely to choose an employer. Nearly **70%** of working parents say child care costs affect their careers.



Increased Productivity
