Child Care Building Improvements Costs



Examples of these expenses include:



Fencing



Bathrooms

Installing or renovating classroom bathrooms



Room additions

Additional wall or room, permanent room separators, doors



Permanent installations

Permanently-installed cabinets, counters, sinks, or toilets



Playground equipment

Permanently-installed playground equipment



Utilities

New or replaced lighting, heating, or other building utility equipment



Fire detection

Fire alarm, hard-wired smoke detector additions





Professional Development / Education Costs



Examples of these expenses include:



Staff Training and Development



Teambuilding



Child Development
Associate Credential



Onboarding and Staff Requirements

Examples include CPR, first aid training, TB testing, drug screens, etc.



Computer or Technology Needs



Child Care Management Services

Examples include Quickbooks, online payroll systems. etc.





Child Care Program Equipment Costs



Examples of these expenses include:



Furniture

Furniture such as tables, chairs, cubbies, cots, cribs, mattresses, and strollers



Consumables

Consumables such as soap and cleaning supplies



Diapering and Toileting

Diapering and toileting materials such as stools, gloves, diaper changing paper, or barrier



Health and Safety

Health and safety supplies such as first aid kits or thermometers



Feeding Materials

Materials for eating, such as plates, and cooking utensils



Appliances

Appliances such as refrigerators, ovens, dishwashers, or other necessary items for food preparation
